- Protect yourself from authoritarian regimes.
- Become uncancellable. Your speech is censorship-resistant.
- Sovereign infra hosted by we, the people.

General Situation

We cannot learn anything from existing popular L1s/L2s since they offer no insight or originality into community crafting. Just the same bland marketing and mechanical blogs putting out buzzword content.

Compared with the DeFi days, new crypto entrants are lazy, they are just looking to buy the next coin that's gonna pump, not doing anything fancy onchain. Either retail is not fully here yet or the new retail is just dumber.

It seems there is an ever shrinking pool of liquidity that is mercenary and everyone is fighting zerosum for that pool. For darkfi to join that fray is a losing proposition, we have to create our own market. However retail in general is exhausted and skeptical of crypto.

While creating own market is good, we can be attactive to existing crypto community since everyone is jaded about how crypto has gone.

We have to become a movement the same way like linux or silk road (note: not saying we approve of illegal things), which rallied people to a cause. People in crypto are here cos a) they answered the cypherpunk call and b) number go up to different degrees etc, but it's pretty much always these two things.

Right now there's a big sense of malaise. The underlying values have been worn away and ppl are realizing that number won't go up if there's no real vision to offer. That mindset can be dangerous and paralyzing. We have an opportunity to present an alternative vision for crypto. It's powerful bc it taps into why ppl are here in the first place.

I remember in zuzalu there was a couchsurfing guy spreading 'mindpoison' which was to the effect of nobody can ever do anything, nobody can change nothing, and people were listening to it like it's wisdom. So part of our strategy involves combating that malaise. This is a general problem of contemporary mindset, not unique to crypto but exists there too.

There's a malaise where no new narratives have been formed-ppl are leaving crypto for other things. The only narrative rn is pretty much the halvening but there's a sense among crypto insiders that no real value has been created. There's also a segment of initially ideological people (arthur hayes) or self bullshitters (gav wood), that now stay for the liquidity and their actions don't follow their ideological line. Many of these pay lip service to the original values, and it's kinda like "ok the ship is sinking, i don't believe anymore, but lets take everything".

Who Is Our Target Audience

There are 4 audience categories: traders (speculators who give value to the token by buying it), users (who actually run the software), developers (who will help us build DarkFi and the surrounding ecosystem), and prophets, who help prophetize the product.

We need to consistently target these 4 groups but the priority changes over time, i.e. currently our main priority is devs, the majority of our users are also devs, with few exceptions (LunarDAO), and we are not trying to gain large numbers of users (yet), but are still in core community building phase. Similarly we are not targetting traders now, since our token is not liquid, however we still want to capture mindset within the crypto market (i.e. prophets).

Coming up to mainnet (EOY):

- We need to ramp up media targetted to traders.
- We will need even more devs to build out the ecosystem.
- (From mainnet onward...) We actually need to onboard large numbers of users.

These categories can be further classifed within these subgroups:

- 1. Free software, Linux, non-crypto p2p crowd, ideological cypherpunks, disenfranchised yoof ($^{devs?}$)
 - a. Suckless minimal Linux idealists
 - b. p2p infra crowd (Matrix, Mastodon)
 - c. Old school cypherpunk hackers (a dying breed?)
 - d. Young devs trapped in companies that want to build something beautiful
- 2. Crypto Native (traders?, prophets?)
 - a. Reactionary libertarians, network-states, e/acc, Milady crowd
 - b. Privacy freaks
 - c. Lefty DAO community people
- 3. Underground systemd markets, private entrepreneurs, agorists, dark forest communities ("", prophets?")
 - a. Tor markets
 - b. Those anon phones sold for private entrepreneurs
 - c. Radically decentralized orgs
 - d. Dark Forest/ post-web movements that reject the internet
- 4. Populist rage against globalism ("", prophets?")
 - a. Oddysee, truth-social, anti-censorship crowd
- 5. Privacy liberals (users?, prophets?)
 - a. Human rights and counter-surveillance activists, journalists, Free speech advocates

Some of these groups are particulary strategic in a crypto context (see: all the crypto projects airdropping to Milady since it's a trendy crowd that overlaps with a lot of influencers), i.e. if we strategically target some key groups it could lead to viral contangion in other circles also.

Strengths and Weaknesses

As a project we have clout within crypto, esp ideological types due to our adherance to philosophy. We don't shy away from rhetoric which in many ways marginalizes us in many ways, and makes us a target for the authorities. Many people are wary of working with us or giving us a platform.

"I saw this article last year, and have thought about it since then. tbh I am not aligned with this way of thinking. My goal here, with the show and the zk channels, is to show people how cool ZK is, how it can be used for great things that will push our society forward, that will benefit many people. I am not down with zk for "extending the space of illegality outward" or just tearing shit down because its imperfect . In fact, I think motions in that direction actually do the field a disservice."

But this weakness is actually our strength. We are distinct from the other projects due to having a philosophy. We are known for this and it gives us an edge. Our positioning is essentially to be the lightning rod or populist rallying cry for a return to the core values and vision of what crypto was going to be. And not just crypto, but the wider technology field in general which has a malaise.

DarkFi is speaking truth to power unyielding in the face of corrupt elites.

There is a cyclical embrace where the more states crackdown on crypto, the more it validates our thesis, bifurcating crypto and pushing liquidity to "go dark" (with darkfi leading the charge). See the lunarpunk dark side of the cycle for more info.

Format

Question: could we do a mix of these?

Another key question: should we perhaps have multiple channels, to have a more "decentralized" approach to narrative building? We may want to avoid putting all of the content out from the "DarkFi official channel". For example: Maybe DarkFi official channel could focus on toned down technical content, and we use a different forum (like an Agorism youtube) to go into philosophy. Or perhaps DarkFi only publishes slick polished philosophy shorts and product demos, and we do interviews and longer form content on a different channel (like a community channel or Agorist Informant YouTube etc). The general legal strategy (which needs to be thought through with our lawyer) will also impact this (since she advised us to do the communication anonymously).

Lastly memetics is very influential within crypto. See channels such as:

- Leonardo of Biz
- Bizonacci

We could maybe do something more general with memes such as the /g/ telegram group, or at least we should tap into some of that reactionary ideological zoomer tech energy. Although many of them are skeptical of crypto as a scam.

We make decent meme material, but we haven't found a good strategy for propagating them widely.
